The e-Duke Books Scholarly Collection includes between 100 and 120 new electronic books published by Duke University Press in the humanities and social sciences in 2011. In years in which they purchase the collection, customers also receive access to over 1,200 backlist titles.

The collection is hosted on the ebrary® platform. Duke content is not included in any other ebrary aggregation but is cross-searchable with other ebrary content.

Individual titles in electronic format are available from select vendors, including YBP Library Services and ebrary.
