

# e-Duke Scholarly Collection 2006 Pricing Information Sheet

The e-Duke Scholarly Collection includes online access to twenty-nine Duke humanities and social science journals. Pricing for the collection is based on the regular subscription rate of twenty titles; the nine journals that are also available on Project Muse are included in the e-Duke Scholarly Collection at no additional cost.

Access to all twenty-nine journals in the collection includes not only the 2006 issues as they are published, but also all available issues from the 2000–2005 volumes.

## PRICING MODEL

The pricing model is derived from the model originally created by Project Muse, which combines a tier system based on the Carnegie Classification with usage statistics to create price categories. But because no reliable usage statistics are currently available, the 2006 and 2007 e-Duke Scholarly Collection prices for all libraries will be based on median usage.

For 2008 subscriptions, once reliable 2006 usage statistics are available from HighWire Press, Duke University Press will use usage quartiles in combination with the current tiered pricing to determine e-Duke Scholarly Collection rates.

**For 2005 e-Duke Scholarly Collection subscribers:** As a result of the change in the 2006 pricing structure, some subscribers from 2005 may experience significant price changes. To prevent significant impact on institutional budgets, Duke University Press will cap the increase at \$500 per year.

**For all 2006 e-Duke Scholarly Collection subscribers:** For 2006 subscribers to the e-Duke Scholarly Collection, Duke University Press will limit increases for the tier-based, median-usage Collection price to 6% or 8% for 2007, depending on whether any new titles are added.

In 2008, once usage-based pricing with quartiles is instituted, the rates for individual institutions will change depending on quartile assignment. The price will increase or decrease for each institution based on their HighWire usage statistics.

## AGENT AND CONSORTIAL DISCOUNTING AND TERMS

Agents and consortia will continue to receive a 2.5% discount on collection orders. In addition, for renewal orders, agents and consortia are eligible for a 2.5% post-sales commission, provided that they meet all requirements; and for new orders, agents and consortia are eligible for a one-time 7.5% post-sales commission. (*New orders are defined as customers who have not previously purchased the e-Duke Scholarly Collection, not customers who are new to a particular agent or consortium.*)

**To qualify for a post-sales commission, the following criteria must be met:**

1. Final prices must be confirmed by Duke University Press before initial payment is submitted. (*Any incorrect payments will be returned without processing.*)
2. IP addresses for the subscriber must be provided promptly with a signed site license agreement.
3. Site license negotiation must be completed before the commission is granted.
4. Library e-resource contact information, including e-mail, phone number, and mailing address, must be included.

**Prepayment and a signed site license are required before access is granted.**

**Post-sales commissions may not be deducted from payment.**
