

2009 Pricing Information

The e-Duke Books Scholarly Collection includes at least 100 new electronic books published by Duke University Press in the humanities and social sciences in a calendar year. In years in which they have purchased the collection, customers also receive access to over 900 available backlist titles. (The only Duke titles excluded from the electronic collection are titles of regional or popular interest or titles to which Duke does not hold electronic rights.)

The e-Duke Books Scholarly Collection is hosted on the ebrary® platform. Duke content is not included in any other ebrary aggregation but is cross-searchable with other ebrary content.

FEATURES OF THE COLLECTION INCLUDE

- tiered discounting
- access to approximately **900 backlist titles**
- a \$500 print add-on option that includes cloth editions of all titles in the collection for the current year
- free MARC catalog records, including chapter-level metadata

FEATURES ON EBRARY INCLUDE

- InfoTools (links to additional reference materials and other resources)
- a personal bookshelf where readers can automatically save books, highlighted text, notes, and bookmarks
- multi-user access
- full-text searching across all titles to which the institution has access via ebrary
