The collection is available to libraries through purchase, lease, or lease-to-own.



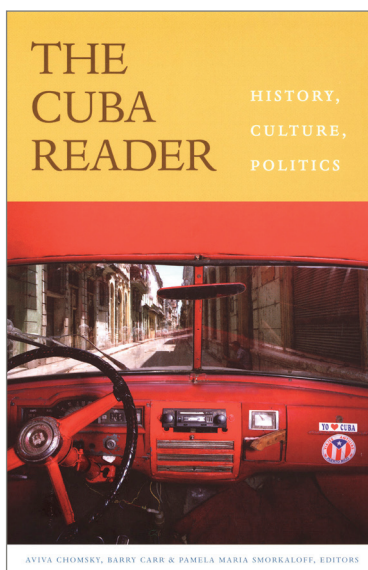
